Classes and workshops led by Tom and Mary invite all levels of haiku writers to feel at home, enriched and challenged in this participatory and intimate gathering.

Participants are encouraged to workshop poems written during our time together as well as poems brought from home. There will be opportunities for everyone to learn and receive feedback with both facilitators. Generative activities include nature and bird walks as well as writing prompts and time for quiet reflection.

Tom Painting teaches at the Paideia School in Atlanta, GA. His students have been recognized in the United Nations International School Haiku Competition and the Nicholas Virgilio Memorial Haiku Contest. Tom served as an associate editor for the haiku journal *The Heron's Nest* and has been active in the haiku community for over thirty years. Tom is an avid birder and leads walks for his school community.

Mary Stevens is author of haiku collection *enough light* (2023). She judged the Peggy Willis Lyles Awards contest (2024) and is a judge for the Touchstone Awards. With the Route 9 Haiku group, she publishes the haiku journal *Upstate Dim Sum*. Mary is a freelance book indexer living in the Hudson Valley, NY. She loves capturing beauty and meaning through writing and expressive movement.

Travel

Plan to arrive in town in time for our Thursday night dinner. At night the roads are dark and animals abound. If you get a flat it can be a long wait with no cell service.

Portal is remote. Downtown Portal boasts a historic library & post office. That's it! Besides wine & sundries at the Portal Peak Lodge & Cafe there are no regular grocery or drug stores within 1 hour of Portal. The closest gas station is 25 miles.

Accessibility

The patio with outdoor bird feeders at the Cave Creek Ranch is a great alternative for the ginko if the walk is not accessible for you. If you have any other needs please contact us.

What to bring

- Sturdy shoes, socks and casual clothes. Bring cool clothes for hot days and a layer for cool mornings or evenings. It can be windy and long sleeves and pants will help.
- Bring sun hat, sunscreen, sunglasses and flashlight (your phone will do!).
- Bring binoculars if you have them. Check the registration form if you need a loaner pair.
- Bring \$1's and \$5's if you wish to visit the various local bird feeder stations.

Safety

Rattlesnakes are in this area. You will be instructed in safety measures and we will be practicing mindful walking. Good for you and good for haiku!

In case of an emergency, EMT services are available. The drive to urgent care is an hour away. A helicopter pad is one minute from the lodge for flight-for-life emergencies.
